Today - The Philadelphia Eleven Film Screening: To commemorate the 50th Anniversary of the Philadelphia Eleven, the first women in the Episcopal Church to be ordained, we will be screening the 90 min film at All Saints in two parts. All Saints Door & Alarm System Update: We are having a number of false alarms go off again, If you are a building user with a door code or key, please follow these procedures when entering or exiting the building. Entering through the kitchen door triggers 90% of the alarms.

Entering Building:

- o Enter through the front Red Doors
- o To disarm the security alarm, enter the code and the number 1.
- o If you bobble the alarm code, simply repeat, entering the code and the number 1.
- o If a fault shows on the panel, clear it by entering the code and the number 1 one more time
- o Put your name on the dry erase board and remove it when you exit.

Exiting the building:

Is the board clear of building users? If you are the last person to exit, check these things before setting the alarm:

- Lights off in Parish Hall? back hall by Rector's office? Nave?
- Fire door on ramp to Parish Hall closed?

- NW Nave i.e. handicapped accessible door locked? Crash bar should be released, crash bar key located on window frame to the right of the door. Hold down crash bar while turning the key and it should release when you let go.
- Two green lights on alarm panel?
- If all this is done and complete, set alarm and exit building through the front door.

Landscaping – Adopt a Plant: For the new garden areas in the Northside parking. Hostas, Ferns, Oregon Grape, Fescue Grass and Trees. You can sign up on the poster in the Parish Hall to sponsor a plant or two or more. Estimated costs are-Trees \$85, Oregon Grape \$40, Hostas \$20, Ferns \$15, Fescue \$10. Planting Soil \$500.

We will be ordering planting soil and volunteers will spread the soil to the designated areas this month. Planting of the perennials will take place in the fall. We will plant some annuals in the meantime to bring some color.

Outreach

Outreach July 19 & 20: The Pantry served groceries to 158 households, 3 fewer households than last week. This represents 360 individuals, up by 3 from last week. 34 ready-to-eat bags went out to our neighbors, 10 more than last week. Hot Meals served 70 patrons inside, down by 5, and 60 sandwiches to-go, down by 10 from last week.
