## The Lesson

**James 3:13-4:3, 7-8a**

Who is wise and understanding among you? Show by your good life that your works are done with gentleness born of wisdom. But if you have bitter envy and selfish ambition in your hearts, do not be boastful and false to the truth. Such wisdom does not come down from above, but is earthly, unspiritual, devilish. For where there is envy and selfish ambition, there will also be disorder and wickedness of every kind. But the wisdom from above is first pure, then peaceable, gentle, willing to yield, full of mercy and good fruits, without a trace of partiality or hypocrisy. And a harvest of righteousness is sown in peace for those who make peace.

Those conflicts and disputes among you, where do they come from? Do they not come from your cravings that are at war within you? You want something and do not have it; so you commit murder. And you covet something and cannot obtain it; so you engage in disputes and conflicts.

You do not have, because you do not ask. You ask and do not receive, because you ask wrongly, in order to spend what you get on your pleasures.

Submit yourselves therefore to God. Resist the devil, and he will flee from you. Draw near to God, and he will draw near to you.

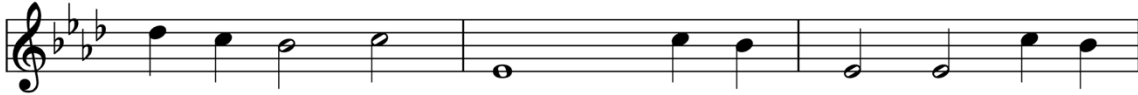

**Our Stewardship Campaign for 2025 is underway:** Episcopal parishes don't receive any ongoing funding from the diocese or national church. Parish funding is primarily dependent on the members of the church. (All Saints is fortunate that we estimate we'll also receive approximately \$70,258 in building rental income in 2025.) Together we contribute to pay staff salaries, DPA, utilities (\$41,408 in 2025) and property insurance (\$10,735.) Parishes owe the annual Diocesan Program Assessment (DPA) to the diocese, and the diocese has a similar payment to the national church. The DPA amount for each parish is determined by its total pledges for the prior year, and in 2024, All Saints is paying \$42,419 for our DPA to the Diocese of Oregon, and we estimate the 2025 amount will be \$43,819.
