





Outreach

Outreach November 1 & 2: The Pantry served groceries to 182 households, down by 40. This represents 339 individuals, a decrease of 128. We served 26 bags of ready-to-eat food. Down by 9. Hot Meals served 78 meals inside, 5 more than last week, and sent out 45 sandwiches to-go, 21 fewer than last week.
