Today we are in the season of Advent, which marks the beginning of the church year. Advent is a time of preparation, expectation and prayerful yearning for the birth of Jesus and his second coming. Advent comes from a Latin word that means "coming." We wear blue vestments at All Saints during Advent, following the Anglican Sarum Rite. Blue symbolize royalty, the coming of the King, hope, the color of the night sky before the dawn, the sea before creation, and Mary.



The Second Lesson Hebrews 10:5-10

When Christ came into the world, he said,

"Sacrifices and offerings you have not desired, but a body you have prepared for me;

in burnt offerings and sin offerings you have taken no pleasure.

Then I said, 'See, God, I have come to do your will, O God' (in the scroll of the book it is written of me)."

When he said above, "You have neither desired nor taken pleasure in sacrifices and offerings and burnt offerings and sin offerings" (these are offered according to the law), then he added, "See, I have come to do your will." He abolishes the first in order to establish the second. And it is by God's will that we have been sanctified through the offering of the body of Jesus Christ once for all.
