## THE WP VOLUNTEER NETWORK

I've had the privilege to serve in this position for almost nine months now. During that time, we have negotiated many changes, dealt with weather extremes, gathered around a neighbor who was experiencing a medical emergency and worked for three weeks without access to the pantry. That's just what I can remember.

And yet, you all never missed a beat. You served our neighbors through, and despite, every obstacle thrown in our path. And you served special holiday groceries and shared food with our unhoused neighbors over Thanksgiving!

You see this motto all the time.

### It Takes a Community, And We Are It!

But it's not just a slogan. It's a reality. This pantry was born from neighbors recognizing an unmet need in our area and collaborating to fill the need. Since the beginning, the Woodstock Pantry has been a community effort, driven by a vision of food for all.

Our community continues to grow and develop. And the services you all provide demonstrate that when we join together, we really can create a place and space where neighbors care for neighbors and we all can experience more food security. So, thank you all for everything you do!

### SAD NEWS

We have a friend, Ghena, a man from Moldova. He is unhoused. This winter I found him outside the church in critical condition – hypothermia and frost bite from the freeze. We all helped him get to the hospital. Thankfully, he survived. We saw him a bit after that. But then, he disappeared...and at least two freezes came and went.

This weekend, we saw him again. Another neighbor who lives in her truck brought him to the pantry. He was caught in the freezing weather again, without shelter. His last trip to the hospital ended with him losing both legs, from the knee down.

I have no words...just profound grief.

A couple of years ago, two political consultants launched "People for Portland," an effort to essentially try and make Portland 'great again' by further criminalizing houselessness and **shifting money from real supportive health and human services toward hiring more law enforcement**. We've experienced the devastating results of similar moves across Washington, Clackamas, and Multnomah counties over the last few years to make Oregon a home that's safe only for some of us.
